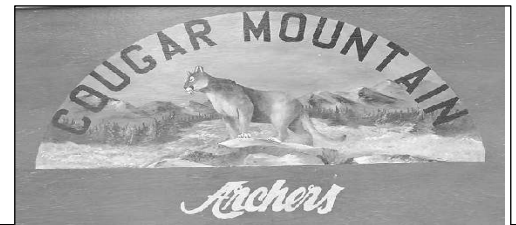

### **Legislative News:**

CA. Fish & Game Commission & the Department of CA.F&W are presently in the middle of discussing and setting the many seasons and regulations for Mammals and Furbearers presently. April 9, 2015 will be the final discussion meeting of Commission for 2015's regulations to be held in Santa Rosa at the Flamingo Conference Resort. Much discussion is being presented this spring in opposition to Bobcat trapping/management, Coyotes, award contests for wildlife, non-lead ammunition. Just to mention some of the opposition to future wildlife management through hunting.

(Be polite, but to the point.) One only wonders where our present Wildlife Historical Proven Methods of managing all our Renewable Natural Resources is going to end. We as the Silent Majority of population in this state and across our United States of America must begin speaking out to our government officials more to reestablish past freedoms this country was founded on by our forefathers.

In addition to present meetings on hunting regulation. Recently I received the latest Legislative Information on present Bills introduced to change more State Laws.

The first is AB96, which will control Sale, Importation or Possession of Ivory from other countries. In general we say it does not affect me, but many off shoots of implementing the law has serious affects, normally we do not think about. Reason it is being opposed.

AB290 Game Mammals:Big Game Management Account, that is being held to address future management of our Wild Pig Management. Presently only people who enjoy Wild Pigs are hunters, as they are enjoyable to hunt plus provide great Meat for the table.

AB367 Clear Lake Wetlands. Which would take \$2,400,000. from the Fish & Game Preservation Fund, from License and Tag money, and could harm several other Conservation Projects.

AB395 Repeal of Non-Lead Ammunition for Hunting, by our new Assemblyman in Yuba City.

AB462 Firearm Waiting Period, again a spot bill for needed legislation this year.

AB499 Archery Hunting: Concealed Firearms Carry during Archery season. CBH/SAA agreed a few years back because of Pot gardens in hunting areas and Predator populations this was a worth while idea for safety.

## **CBH/SAA Petition actions re: Nor Cal Bowhunters at this years Annual CBH/SAA Meeting in January.**

The CBH/SAA Annual Meeting is now history. There were many items discussed, some approved and some not. The new officers for the year were installed with prepared to do their best for the Association. The Officers put in a lot of volunteer hours running the organization and keeping it viable. The Legislative Committee does an outstanding job looking after our best interests. They attend the California Fish and Wildlife meetings and keep up with all the goings on of the government and its actions. One important issue this past year was the City of Pasadena trying to get rid of the Pasadena Roving Archers. But due to a lot of support by many including the Legislative Committee the assault was beaten back and they are still in business. My thanks to all who were involved in this.

Some of the Items discussed were the 9 petitions submitted within CBH\SAA which would affect some of the By-Laws of the Association.

Petition 1 was a proposed \$5 increase in membership dues which was passed and will be effective on March 1<sup>st</sup> (If you need new applications they are on the CBH/SAA web page, or you can contact me and I will sent one to you electronically.

Petition 2 was a proposed \$5 increase in Charter fees which was approved.

Petition 3 proposed an additional \$10 to the CBH/SAA for Club Range Inspections. Currently the cost is \$15 to NFAA every two years and this proposal would increase that to \$25 with \$10 of that going to CBH/SAA. This petition was voted down.

Petition 4 was a proposal to increase the mileage driven in the performance of their jobs for CBH/SAA officers from .25 cents to .35 cents. This was approved.

Petition 5 was a proposal to split the 2nd VP of Target into two positions. This was approved.

Petition 6 was a proposal to change the type of membership from Associate to Associate Bowhunter and Associate Target member. This was approved.

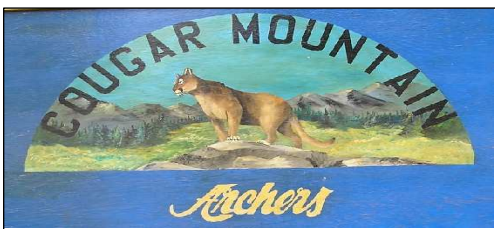
Petition 7 was a proposal to the "flighting" of awards at the State Field to follow NFAA guidelines. This would be 1-15 shooters – one flight, 16-30 shooters – 2 flights, 31-45 shooters - three flights, 46-60 shooters – four flights, etc.. This was approved.

**Petition 8 was a proposal to update the CBH/SAA Classification Chart as it does not list all of the classes nor the age groups for Senior. An updated chart was attached to the petition. This was approved and if you would like a copy it is on the CBH/SAA web page or you can contact me and I will send one to you electronically.**

**Petition 9 was withdrawn by its submitter.**
